

About This Property

Much of the conserved land in this area is a result of the Beals family purchasing property in the 1960s to protect it from development.

The family permanently protected part of the land by donating the 3.4-acre Triangle Meadow and a 48-acre conservation restriction (CR), both to SVT.

In 2006, the residents of Southborough voted to purchase a CR on 130 acres of Chestnut Hill Farm. The funds needed to purchase this community treasure were raised through a grant from the state and through private fundraising by SVT and Southborough Open Land Foundation (SOLF). Ownership of the CR has since been transferred to The Trustees of Reservations.

The family also donated the 50-acre Beals Preserve to SOLF, with a CR held by SVT.

Please note: These lands are still working farms. Please stay on marked trails and stay away from any livestock or farm equipment. Please do not enter areas marked as private.

Features of Note

- Trails at the Beals Preserve pass through meadows and woodlands, alongside a pond, and over the Wachusett Aqueduct.
- Trails at the nearby Chestnut Hill Farm lead visitors past fields and pastures, into upland forests, and along wetlands.
- The state's Biodiversity Day was held here in June 2005, and volunteers recorded an amazing total of 425 species.
- During the tally, 123 species of wildflowers, 73 of trees and shrubs, and 47 of birds, some especially attracted to the open grasslands, were counted.

Trail Policies and Regulations

These policies apply to SVT properties on the map. Properties owned by other entities have their own posted policies.

The following are prohibited:

- Motorized vehicles
- · Hunting or trapping
- Camping
- Bicycling
- Fires
- Disposing of trash or yard waste
- Cutting or removing plants

Dog walkers:

- Pick up and dispose of dog waste.
- Keep dogs on trails.
- Keep dogs out of ponds/streams/vernal pools.
- Put dogs on a leash when other hikers approach.

Directions

With mapping software, search for this address: 9–99 Chestnut Hill Road, Southborough, MA

From Route I-495, take Exit 23A to Route 9 east toward Framingham. Go approximately 2.0 miles. Turn left onto Route 85 north toward Southborough. Go 1.2 mile. Turn left onto Route 30 west toward Westborough. Go 1.2 miles. Turn right onto Chestnut Hill Road. Go 0.2 mile. Turn right into the parking lot.
